

What is Port Ambrose?

It is a deepwater port that would bring explosive liquefied natural gas (LNG) tankers to the NY/NJ region. Port Ambrose could be used for both the import and export of LNG.

It's a project of Liberty Natural Gas, an unknown foreign corporation whose ownership is hidden within a bank account in the Cayman Islands.



Top Concerns with Port Ambrose:

- Would establish the region's first industrial facility in 14 years, thus opening the door to harmful industrialization of our shores.
- Would be a hazardous facility positioned just outside the New York Harbor, in the most densely populated region of the country, and in one of the most security sensitive regions in the world. LNG tankers are highly volatile and documented terrorist targets.
- Would be a navigational hazard near the entrance to the busiest port on the east coast and between heavily trafficked shipping lanes used to transport flammable cargo including petroleum and other chemicals.
- LNG takes large amounts of energy to compress, transport, and re-gasify, and is comprised primarily of methane, which is 85 times more potent than carbon dioxide over a 20-year period.
- Would exclude fishermen from important and traditional fishing grounds, threatening their livelihoods, and offers the creation of just 5 permanent jobs.
- Would damage marine habitat and threaten marine life including endangered species, such as whales and sea turtles.
- The Port Ambrose undersea pipeline would be located over an earthquake fault line.

The US has natural gas, so there is no need to import more of it!

Existing import facilities are closing or switching to exports.

Governor Christie or Cuomo can stop Port Ambrose with veto.
